United Methodist General Conference

As this newsletter goes to print, the UMC General Conference will convene. Rev. Jamey Pricket emailed this letter to the church on Sunday, April 21:

Gainesville First UMC,

From April 23rd to May 3rd, 862 voting delegates from four continents who speak ten distinct languages will assemble in Charlotte, North Carolina, for the General Conference of The United Methodist Church.

The General Conference is the highest legislative body in The United Methodist Church. Delegates gather from all over the world to consider revisions to church law and adopt resolutions on current moral, social, public policy, and economic issues. The General Conference also approves plans and budgets for church-wide programs for the next four years.

One of those delegates will be our very own Lee Highsmith. She will join the other 21 delegates from North Georgia in Charlotte as they gather to hear legislation, adopt resolutions, and be challenged to see the United Methodist Church be sent out on a mission to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

The conference theme will be "...and know that I am God," taken from Psalm 46. The psalm refers to being still and trusting God. We invite you to join us in praying for the delegates to have a stillness of heart and mind so that they may discern God's will for the denomination.




